A Note About Our Liturgy

Our readings this week call us to a deep sense of love and mercy for everyone around us; our "good neighbors" and our "bad neighbors." In this, the final part of Jesus' "Sermon on the Mount," we hear God's teachings on Retaliation and Love of our Enemies. The first part of the Gospel includes the famous phrase "turn the other cheek." This is in stark opposition to the Old Testament teaching of "an eye for an eye." Jesus is telling us to look for our love for each person rather than retaliating against anyone who has wronged us. How often, when we feel wronged, do we think, "I wish the same would happen to them. . ." or "they'll get what they deserve. . .?" When we have these thoughts, are we "turning the other cheek" and showing mercy?

The second part of today's Gospel reminds us that to be God's children, we must show love to everyone, even those who hurt us. How can we be "light for the world" if we are not shining on everyone? Our psalm response, "the Lord is kind and merciful," reminds us of God's care for us, and in turn, we are to show kindness and mercy toward all. God forgives us for our failings and shortcomings, we must do the same to achieve the Kingdom. As it is written in the second reading,"... you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you."

Our readings this week are a perfect conclusion to Ordinary Time and sequitur into Lent. Over the 40 days of Lent, we prepare ourselves spiritually for Christ's death and resurrection. Let us use the "Sermon on the Mount," which we have heard over the last several weeks, as a road map to make this Lent fulfilling and a time of spiritual growth.
