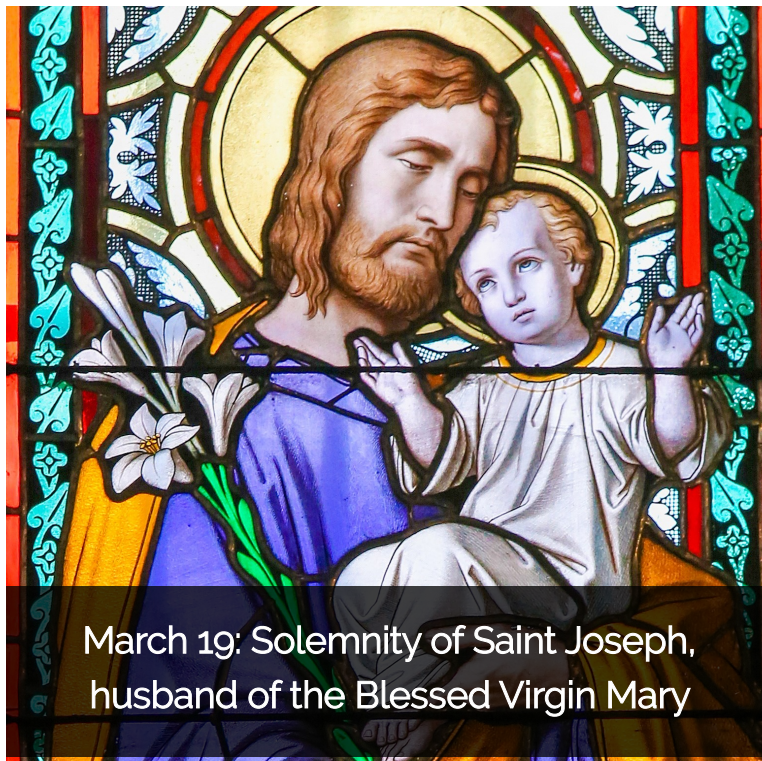

A Note About Our Liturgy

Do we recognize Christ in our midst? How quick are we to shun people who make us uncomfortable or don't meet our social standards?

In last week's Gospel, Jesus' disciples saw his glory revealed through His transfiguration. This week, in John's Gospel passage, Jesus reveals Himself as the Messiah to a sinner and undesirable of society. He is challenging the social structure of the day by asking for water from a Samaritan woman. In Jesus' time, Samaritans were separated from Jewish society and the Samaritan woman was considered ritually impure in faith; because of this, Jews were forbidden from drinking from the same vessel as them. What made Jesus' talking with this woman even more outrageous was that she was even looked down upon by Samaritans because of her promiscuity. As Christians, we are called to be the same open presence to the world, that Christ was in His time. We are called to welcome and help each other and not to judge. Next time we see someone who doesn't measure up to our standards, let's think about how Jesus would embrace that person. Jesus offered "living water" to the Samaritan woman and the world, a sign that He came to save the whole world through His coming resurrection. The Samaritan woman was so moved by Jesus that she went back to town and brought other people to Jesus; Are we bringing the world closer to Christ through our actions?
