
In the Gospel this weekend (Matthew 25:1-13), we hear Jesus tell yet another parable about Heaven. Since we've been hearing several different parables (from Jesus) about Heaven over the course of the past month or so – do you think that there is a reason and that Jesus is sending a message to us? Of course! Jesus wants us to remember we are on a journey that doesn't end here. It's very easy to lose sight of that as we get caught up in the many, many things that are 'human.' Jesus comes right out at the end of the parable to say, "The moral is: keep your eyes open, for you know not the day or the hour." (Mt.25:13) If our eyes have been closed to this reality, maybe it's time to open them up.

Next weekend we celebrate our Patroness, Saint Cabrini, at all Masses. Although her actual feast date is Nov. 13 (Friday) we are allowed to move it to the weekend so all of us can join together as a new church family in celebration. All volunteers are required to complete Safe Environment training through the Diocese of Orlando website prior to serving. For some ministries, fingerprints may be required.








Veterans Appreciation
