My Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

As we soon approach the end of our Easter Season, we gather on this Ascension Weekend (which replaces the Seventh Sunday of Easter) so that we can experience the full cycle of Jesus' life on earth. We know that Jesus ascended into Heaven on Ascension Thursday (May 13), but we also know that not many of the faithful are able to attend Mass on that day. So, in her wisdom, Holy Mother Church allows for it to be transferred to the weekend that follows, when a greater majority of people can attend and appreciate that Jesus did not continue to remain on earth for an indefinite period of time after His Resurrection, but that He did leave with a promise to send a helper and to come back again. The Gospel of Mark (16:15-20) shares with us what happened and the last words of Jesus to His disciples – that we must walk in His ways; evangelize; love one another; and be baptized. What a great message to leave behind. Take an inner journey this weekend to see how we are living up to what Jesus asked us to do – and how we are being ministers in our own right.

<u>Urge Governor DeSantis to Veto Public</u> Funding of Abortifacients

On April 30, the Florida legislature approved a state budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2021. The budget includes a new \$2 million recurring appropriation for the Department of Health to contract with family planning providers, such as Planned Parenthood, in promoting and providing Hormonal Long-acting Reversible Contraception (HLARC). The manufacturers of hormonal intrauterine devices recognize that many women continue to ovulate while using the device; therefore, conception can still occur. However, HLARCs alter the uterine lining and create an inhospitable womb for implantation of the newly-conceived life. This concern is raised in a letter from FCCB Executive Director Michael Sheedy to Governor DeSantis.

Governor DeSantis has line-item veto authority over the budget. Please urge the governor to veto budget line item 500, which allocates \$2 million in public tax dollars to promote and provide abortifacients.
