My Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Today, the universal Church celebrates the Feast of the Holy Trinity. The doctrine of the Trinity developed first out of the Scriptures and the communal prayer of the early church. The doctrine was officially formulated at the Councils of Nicea (325) and Constantinople (381). The Trinity is the affirmation of God's intimate communion with us through Jesus Christ in the Holy Spirit. Christians believe that God intervenes in our lives and is involved in human history.

From the beginning of creation God tried to communicate and relate with all creatures. In the Old Testament God did so through events and the prophets. And in the fullness of time, God became one with humanity in Jesus Christ. By the power of the Holy Spirit, God continues to be altogether present to us, seeking everlasting communion with all creatures. The Incarnation, the Word made flesh, is the ultimate proof of God's infinite love for humanity by becoming one with us. Jesus is the visible image of the invisible God, our model for the Beatitudes, and the norm of the new law: "Love one another as I have loved you." (Jn 15:12)

The brief passage we read today is known as the "Great Commission," and it tells of the risen Christ sending the disciples forth to all the nations. The opening scene takes place on a mountain in Galilee. Jesus instructed His disciples to go there. After they arrived Jesus appears to them. Once realizing that it is He, they are excited, overjoyed and they worship Him. Then, within minutes, something happens and doubt sets in. Wonder what was going on here? Did they think this was just an illusion? Was it someone pretending to be Jesus? Only they knew what they were thinking. As Jesus approaches them, we find out what this is all about. He commissions that they are to go forth and preach, making disciples of all nations, and baptizing them.

This "Great Commission" also applies to us today. We are asked to do the same thing that the disciples were asked to do – to preach, teach, and baptize. Sounds like a message that we've heard before.
