

ELEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Jesus said to them, 'This is how it is with the kingdom of God; it is as if a man were to scatter seed on the land and would sleep and rise night and day and the seed would sprout and grow, he knows not how. Of its own accord the land yields fruit, first the blade, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the grain is ripe, he wields the sickle at once, for the harvest has come.'

He said, 'To what shall we compare the kingdom of God, or what parable can we use for it? It is like a mustard seed that, when it is sown in the ground, is the smallest of all the seeds on the earth. But once it is sown, it springs up and becomes the largest of plants and puts forth large branches, so that the birds of the sky can dwell in its shade.' My Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we hear an interesting Gospel (Mark 4: 26-34) that can be referred to as the Parable of the Growing Seed – a unique parable to Mark that refers to the Kingdom of God – followed by another parable about the Mustard Seed. We know that Jesus always used parables (everyday stories about everyday life) to make sense to those who listen, thus the beginning of this parable states the obvious – that in order to be a good gardener, the first step on the road to success is that you need to plant a seed in the ground – basic and necessary. Then the parable goes on to tell the course of events that occur afterwards, which we can read and refresh ourselves with from the cover of this bulletin. Since we know that the point of this parable is for Jesus to share information about the Kingdom of God. To summarize: The seed is the Word of God. Plant it and give it time; The growth of the plant is how God's Word works in our hearts – and it cannot be forced; God accomplishes His purpose even when we are absent or unaware of what He's doing; The goal of all of this is the harvest. So – we must be faithful in 'sowing the seed,' praying for a harvest, and leave the results to Jesus. What this means for us is that we must share God's Word with others,

especially the Good News of Jesus Christ as found in the Gospels. If we are not planting these seeds in others, we will not see the Kingdom grow. And the second part of this Gospel, in talking about the Mustard Seed – tells us two things: God's Kingdom starts small and God's Kingdom will grow surprisingly large and finish strong. All we have to do in both of these parables - is plant the seed!
