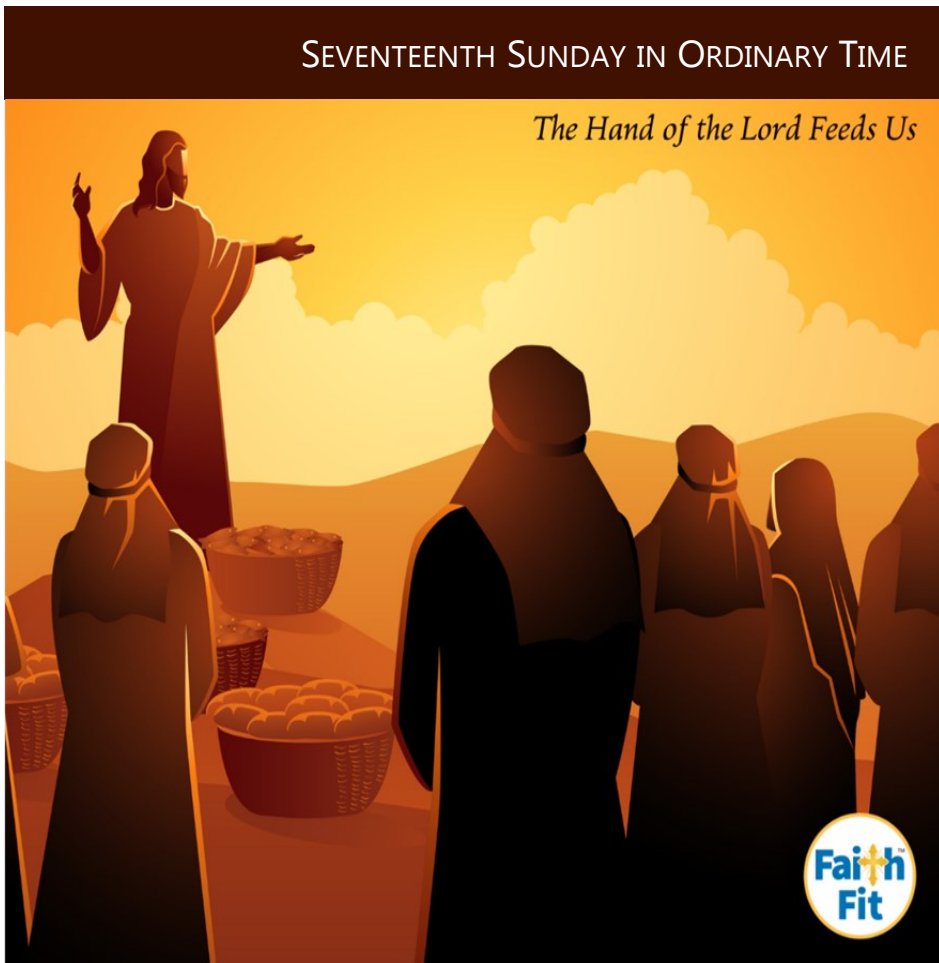

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The Hand of the Lord Feeds Us



"After this Jesus went to the other side of the Sea of Galilee, also called the Sea of Tiberias. A large crowd kept following him, because they saw the signs that he was doing for the sick. Jesus went up the mountain and sat down there with his disciples. Now the Passover, the festival of the Jews, was near. When he looked up and saw a large crowd coming towards him, Jesus said to Philip, 'Where are we to buy bread for these people to eat?' He said this to test him, for he himself knew what he was going to do. Philip answered him, 'Six months' wages would not buy enough bread for each of them to get a little.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to him, 'There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish. But what are they among so many people?' Jesus said, 'Make the people sit down.' Now there was a great deal of grass in the place; so, they sat down, about five thousand in all. Then Jesus took the loaves, and when he had given thanks, he distributed them to those who were seated; so also, the fish, as much as they wanted. When they were satisfied, he told his disciples, 'Gather up the fragments left over, so that nothing may be lost.' So, they gathered them up, and from the fragments of the five barley loaves, left by those who had eaten, they filled twelve baskets. When the people saw the sign that he had done, they began to say, 'This is indeed the prophet who is to come into the world.'"

Pastor's Corner

My Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

Even though some of us may not particularly like taking a test, tests are necessary in order to learn, grow, expand our minds, and for advancement in life. Almost everything that makes us who we are may involve a test - including, at times, Faith. Faith must be tested for it to strengthen and increase. God wants us to trust Him more and so this particular type of test is not about passing or failing, but it's about having that opportunity to learn and understand that we can trust God with our concerns, needs and with the trials of our lives - and that He has the answers.

A Faith that is tested is a Faith that can grow - if we choose for it to grow. In the Gospel this weekend (John 6: 1-15), Jesus is training the disciples, and He is strengthening their faith by giving them a test. How? With the foundation of God's Word as a basis, He wants them to see the wonderful things that God can do in their lives - and through them - by asking a very simple question, "Where shall we buy bread for these people to eat?" (John 6:5). Jesus also wanted His disciples to think of the available options that were at their disposal - and how they might be creative in putting their trust in God as they were being tested.

God gives us the foundation that we need for life and, if we are open to receiving it, always gives us an answer that might very well be better than ours - but not necessarily easier. The true test is how we interpret and apply it. This will allow us to respond with increased spirituality so that we can learn and grow in our Faith. The question that we ask ourselves is - are we willing to trust Him?

What is a Mass Intention?

Whenever a priest celebrates Mass, he has at least two specific intentions. The first intention is to celebrate the Mass according to the rubrics of the Church, provided by the Church. The second is to apply the grace of that Mass towards an intention or specific need. These are offered to God as either: 1) The remembering of the soul of a Deceased Person; or 2) The offering of a Special Intention for someone who is living, and may be facing challenges.

(Paraphrased from the Basilica of Saint Mary, Alexandria, VA)

How to Request a Mass Intention?

To request a Mass Intention, please email Fr. Charles at: FrCharles@SaintCabriniCatholic.org. In your email, remember to include: the name of the individual that you would like mentioned; whether they are (Repose of the Soul Of) Deceased; or (The Special Intention Of) Living; if you have a specific date & Mass time in mind; and your name & phone number. Normal Church protocol suggests that we announce one Intention (name) per Mass.

Candidates making their Holy Sacraments:

- 1) 1st & 2nd Graders: Needing the Sacraments of First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion.
- 2) 7th & 8th Graders: Needing the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Other Programs Offered:

- 3) 9th thru 12th Graders: Youth Group.
- 4) R.C.I.C. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children): For those over the age of 7 needing Sacraments.
- 5) R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). For high schoolers and older needing Sacraments.
