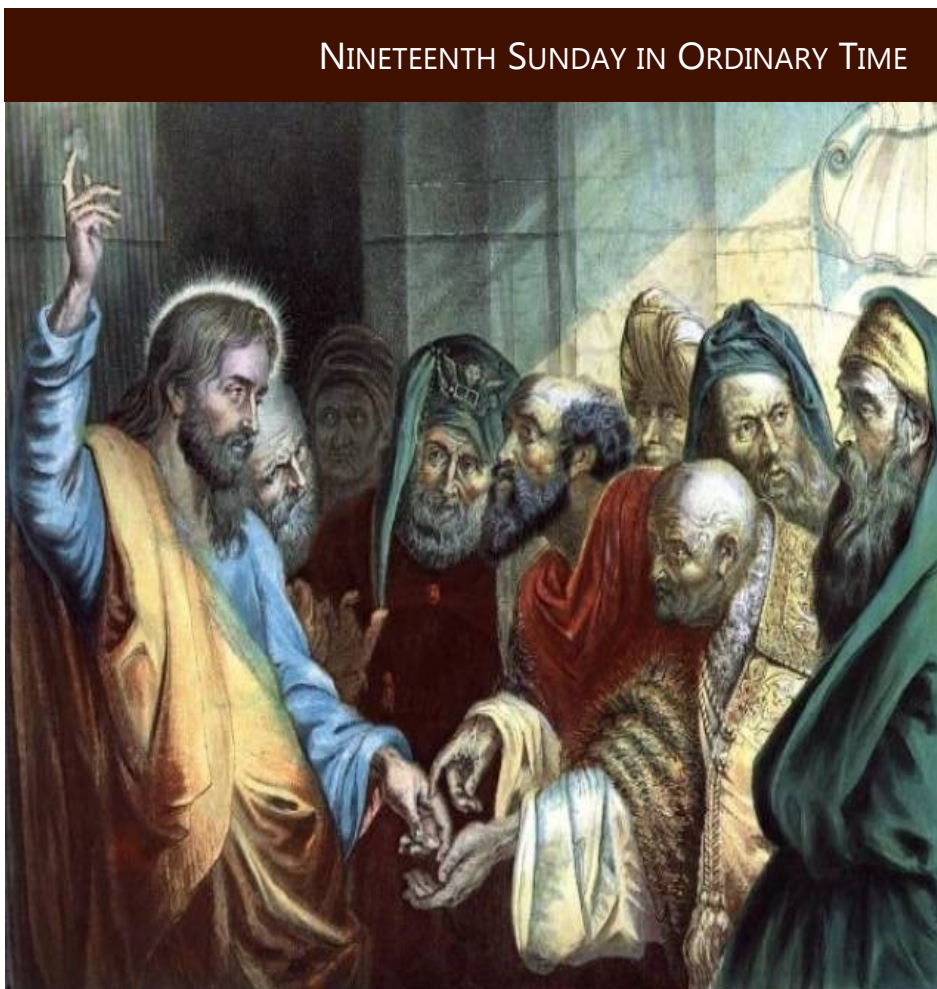

My Dear Sisters & Brothers in Christ,

Hard to believe but summer break is over and schools are in session again. I hope that you had an opportunity to do something a little different that allowed you a restful break and a chance to unwind and recharge the battery a bit. If you didn't physically go anywhere, maybe you were able to step back and look at life from another perspective – and even avail yourselves to local environmental wonders that help the mind and heart relax.

Our 'Set Up & Break Down' Ministry is in full force as we again resume sharing the stage with our host. This wonderful group of volunteer parishioners provide our Church an opportunity to transform the elevated platform into a Sanctuary so that we can all worship around the Altar, be attentive to God's Word, raise our voices in song, follow the Mass parts on the screens, and have a pleasant space in which to worship. Thanks to everyone involved!

This weekend we are all excited to begin registration for our new 'Mini' Faith Formation Program. We already had around two dozen inquiries and we know that more will come forward this weekend. Since we are not able to use any of the teacher classrooms, our inaugural venue will be the school Media Center – and we are beginning this voyage focusing on the Sacraments. Parishioner students entering 1st & 2nd Grade will be preparing for their First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion – and those entering 7th & 8th Grade will learn about the Sacrament of Confirmation. Since we do not have enough space for all of our 3rd, 4th, 5th, and 6th Graders – we are just inviting those who missed any of their Sacraments to join the R.C.I.C. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Children). We also extend a welcome to any adults who need Sacraments to join the R.C.I.A. (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults). The Youth Group component will allow our high schoolers an opportunity to get to know each other and continue together the spiritual journey as church. I am so grateful to Dr. Joe Domingues and to Guinevere, his wife, for taking the reigns and investing a tremendous amount of time in putting this whole adventure together. Their energy and excitement levels have been running high the past couple of months. You wouldn't imagine the numerous details that have to be addressed – and the procedures & policies that need to be followed. Congrats and Thanks to the both of you! Our first Class will be on Sunday, September 12th from 9 AM to 10:15 AM and will follow on the First Two Sundays of each month after (except if schools are on break).

I continue to monitor the progress with the development of our Church property. To date, there isn't much to share. The Diocese is still working with county and state transportation officials to address several future road-widening and extension projects they have had in place with minimal to no impact for our campus. With ongoing growth in Lake Nona, infrastructures are being studied as that section of town is evolving. I know that we are all anxious to have ground breaking so keep the prayers going. As a refresh, we are looking at building a multi-functional Ministry Center that will house Parish Offices, a large central gathering/hall/worship space, an adequate number of classrooms/meeting rooms, and a host of other essentials.

Lastly, on behalf of my sister and family, I express again my appreciation to all of you for your cards and messages of encouragement & consolation!

Diaconate Discernment Nights

The Diocese of Orlando has 250 permanent deacons and another 51 in formation. Diaconate Formation is a comprehensive Ministry formation process involving the four pillars of: Human, Spiritual, Pastoral, and Intellectual Formation. This 6-year Formation process prepares the future ordained Permanent Deacon for his lifelong Vocation and Ministry of: Liturgy, Word, and Charity.

The Office of the Permanent Diaconate in the Diocese of Orlando is calling on its Church Communities to surface and bring forth reputable men - servants in the vineyard who are filled with the Holy Spirit - to discern a call to the Permanent Diaconate. Men seeking to discern this call are encouraged to first have an investigative inquiry and conversation with their pastor, followed by attending a Diaconate Discernment Night. Choose one of the six Discernment Sessions which will be held at Catholic Churches throughout the Diocese in September and October for the convenience of all.
