TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Teacher,' said John, 'we saw someone driving out demons" in your name and we told him to stop, because he was not one of us.' 'Do not stop him,' Jesus said. 'For no one who does a miracle in my name can in the next moment say anything bad about me, for whoever is not against us is for us. Truly I tell you, anyone who gives you a cup of water in my name because you belong to Christ will certainly not lose their reward. But if anyone causes one of these little ones - those who believe in me - to stumble, it would be better for them if a large millstone were hung around their neck and they were thrown into the sea. If your hand causes you to stumble, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life maimed than with two hands to go into Gehenna, where the fire never goes out. And if your foot causes you to stumble, cut it off. It is better for you to enter life crippled than to have two feet and be thrown into Gehenna. And if your eye causes you to stumble, pluck it out. It is better for you to enter the kingdom of God with one eye than to have two eyes and be thrown into Gehenna, where 'the worm dies not and the fire is never extinguished."





My Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

The Gospel passage this weekend shares three lessons that are basic to Christian living today: 1) Faith produces power, 2) Service leads to honor, and 3) Suffering gives us glory. John reports to Jesus that they had seen a man casting out demons 'in His name' and they tried to stop him. It appears that John and the other disciples were jealous and had given offense to the man. Seems like a judgement is being made. They tried to restrain the man and Jesus takes time to teach them an important principle, 'For whoever is not against us is for us.' These words of Jesus speak to the intolerant spirit, to an attitude that says, "Our group is the only group that is right." Jesus here establishes the basis for fellowship among believers. In modern language He can be saying that it doesn't really matter what group we are a part of. If we have received Him as our personal Savior and were born again in baptism, then we are a sister or brother in Christ.

Next, Jesus brings up a subject that is seldom mentioned in religious circles today. He talks about a place called Gehenna, a real place. If we die in our sins apart from the Lord, then we will go to a place where the fire is not quenched and the worm dies not. We must take sin seriously. My hand represents what I do. Is there an action that is not pleasing to God? My foot represents where I go. Is there a place that causes me to sin? My eye represents what I see. Is there something that I observe that leads me down a dark path? If we are humble, then we will know our self, be honest with our self, challenge our self, and work at changing our self. Is there anything in my life that I need to re-boot? If so, don't put it off. Get started!

Deaconate Discernment Nights

The Diocese of Orlando has 250 permanent deacons and another 51 in formation. Diaconate Formation is a comprehensive Ministry formation process involving the four pillars of: Human, Spiritual, Pastoral, and Intellectual Formation. This 6-year Formation process prepares the future ordained Permanent Deacon for his lifelong Vocation and Ministry of: Liturgy, Word, and Charity.

The Office of the Permanent Diaconate in the Diocese of Orlando is calling on its Church Communities

to surface and bring forth reputable men - servants in the vineyard who are filled with the Holy Spirit - to discern a call to the Permanent Diaconate. Men seeking to discern this call are encouraged to first have an investigative inquiry and conversation with their pastor, followed by attending a Diaconate Discernment Night. Choose one of the six Discernment Sessions which will be held at Catholic Church-

es throughout the Diocese in September and October for the convenience of all.


Getting Started
