





Happy 2nd Anniversary to ALL! Hope this finds everyone well as we begin to experience a nicer change in our weather's temperature, the ending of our hurricane season, and the beginning of a new time adjustment. We also are excited about the expansion of our 'Mini' Faith Formation Program, as we open up two additional classrooms to accommodate the many children in our Parish Community who are coming forward for Sacramental Preparation. What a blessing! Continued gratitude to Dr. Joe (our Coordinator), Guinevere (his wife), and our superb Catechetical Team – several who are brand new and recently stepped forward to assist in our expansion process. Another blessing! And we can still benefit from the assistance of others who wish to serve as a Catechist. Take it to prayer!

In this weekend's Gospel (Mark 12: 38-44), there is a bit of a contrast between the self-serving scribes and the humble widow. The scribes are about themselves. They like to be seen, heard, congratulated, and well thought of – and want others to say good things about them behind their backs as well as to their faces. Then there's the widow. She's quiet, private, simple, lives meagerly – and is unable to give out of abundance. No one knows what her life was all about in her younger years. All we know is that she doesn't have much – and that she offers everything she's got to be faithful and helpful to her people, in doing her part. Her 'offering' is truly sacrificial – and it hurts.

Having faith that's alive and important requires that we not be self-absorbed. It calls us to go beyond – to dig deep – in doing the things that we know are right – but that we may not want to do. It turns life from what's convenient into that which will require some effort and creative planning. It's more about the cross and what we give or offer up (time, effort, patience, energy, resources, etc.) in the assistance of others – over what we might receive in return. And isn't that what faith in Jesus Christ is all about?



We are also starting two prayer initiatives. The first is to dedicate the second Friday of each month to praying for Vocations. This idea came to us from Father Ivan Olmo and Father Blake Britton, when they were both at St. Mary Parish in Rockledge. Every second Friday they offered a Holy Hour with Eucharistic Adoration. They would pray the Luminous Mysteries of the Rosary (which St. John Paul II said were particularly helpful for those discerning a vocation), as well as pray a litany for vocations. The second prayer initiative came from Father Miguel Gonzalez. There will be a kneeler dedicated to praying for vocations. It will have prayer cards inside and maybe a few other items related to discernment. We plan to move this kneeler to a different parish each week. It may be placed either in front of a statue in the Church or Chapel, and the people would be encouraged to stop and say a prayer. It is essentially like the "Vocations Blessing Cup", but for Churches and the whole diocese, as opposed to individual families. More information will be released soon.

Lastly, our annual discernment retreat for men ages 18 and up, 'Called by Name' is December 3-5. If you know any possible candidates for this retreat, please encourage them to reach out to the Vocations Office by emailing me or Darcey (jswallows@orlandodiocese.org or ddinh@orlandodiocese.org).
