

My Brothers and Sisters in Christ:



Grace and Peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you. We end our liturgical year with praise and thanksgiving for our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe. We know that Jesus' Kingdom is a spiritual one which exists in each one of us who seeks to know God. We are bound to each other, through, with and in Christ, and as a community of faith, our primary mission is to bear witness to the Truth for which Jesus died; that God loves all people and desires to live with us forever.

It seems fitting then to begin our new liturgical year, during the holy season of Advent, with a focus on the Holy Father's call for us to be a people of synodality. A people of synodality are on a journey and I hearken to the beautiful story of Emmaus where Jesus walks alongside two disciples who have just witnessed His death and have heard stories about His Resurrection. Yet, they did not recognize Him until He spoke with them (shared the Word of God) and broke bread with them (offering them the gift of Himself through the Eucharist). It was only then that they knew He was Jesus. In our journey, we are called to be Jesus to others and to recognize Jesus in others. This journey is one of prayer and sharing and listening so that we grow in our love of God and love of one another as God loves us.

As we begin the season of Advent, it is appropriate for us to ponder how we individually and as a community seek God and journey with God through each other. It is a time to reflect upon our participation (or lack of) in the celebration of Mass. Advent calls us to anticipate the coming of the babe, the Savior of the world. We desire to be ready for His coming. So, we prepare as best we are able to be ready to receive Him and share His goodness throughout the earth. Our Blessed Mother's fiat is a wondrous example of how we are to live faithfully as she proclaimed joyfully, "Yes", to offer herself as the Mother of God for the sake of our salvation.

I pray with you that our journeying together will open our heart to God.






#### Does Your Baby Need to be Baptized?



## **Around the Diocese**

#### **Diocese of Orlando Parishes Welcome Program to Help Parents of Addicts**

Julia Hayden sat on the floor of her room sobbing and broken. Her son had just informed her he was using heroin. "In that moment, I realized I had been waiting for decades for him to hit bottom, so I could fix it all, make it right finally. Really, I had been living at bottom throughout his addiction," she said. She prayed and recalled reading an article about **PAL** (Parents of Addicted Loved ones) four years earlier - a peer-to-peer support group for family members with addicted loved ones. She visited the PAL website and drove 50 miles to the nearest meeting (Saint Thomas Aquinas Parish in Saint Cloud). 'The **PAL** facilitator hugged me that night and told me that my journey of healing has begun,' Hayden said.


PAL is a national organization present in 45 states. Family members and other 18 years of age and older and sober are welcome at the weekly meetings (in person or Zoom). Following a 12-week curriculum, participants are welcome to repeat the series as many times as they wish, and most do. "PAL goes with you and grows with you," she said. They don't offer advice and they don't judge. Instead, they encourage participants to seek trusted professional help. The free meetings are faith-based and begin in prayer. The program offers fact-based information, insight into understanding addiction, and offers coping tools and support. PAL helps parents understand the disease of addiction and the dis-ease that our loved one's



experience. Currently, meetings are held once a week at Saint Thomas Aquinas as well as at Saint James Cathedral, Orlando. Hayden said **PAL** saved her and refers to the program as "God's red carpet to healing."
