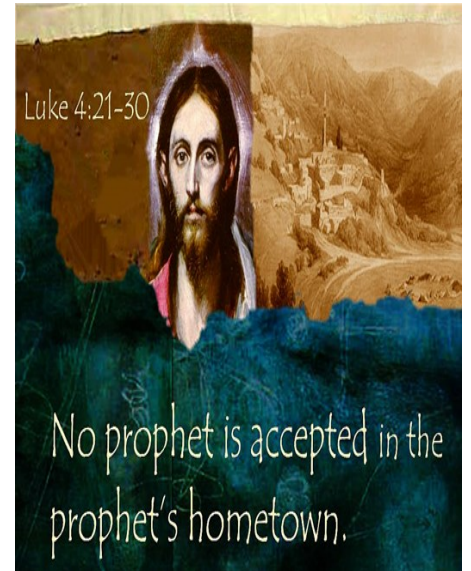

Then he began to say to them, "Today this scripture has been fulfilled in your hearing." All spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his mouth. They said, "Is not this Joseph's son?" He said to them, "Doubtless you will quote to me this proverb, 'Doctor, cure yourself!' From the PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

This weekend we hear an unsettling Gospel account (Luke 4: 21-30) where, after Jesus announces that the Scripture passage is fulfilled in their midst - and that Salvation also includes the Gentiles, those listening are filled with rage and wish to drive Jesus out of His hometown and over the cliff. Since it is common for certain news to upset people, we have to ask ourselves the question, "Why?" The answer can vary and be multiple, but the bottom line is that, when we become enraged, a nerve is touched somewhere. This Jewish group evidently does not believe that anyone, except themselves, qualifies to be saved. Did what Jesus say rub them the wrong way and highly insult them? Or maybe, since they know Jesus since He was a young boy and don't consider Him any better or different than themselves, they are questioning His authority - like, 'Who does He think He is?' Regardless, the bottom line is that they are filled with rage, which can lead to dire consequences. Rage, when left unchecked or uncontrolled, can be very detrimental. Yet, Jesus was able to walk right through it and leave.

This weekend is also the beginning of Catholic Schools Week - where we acknowledge the blessing they accomplish in planting religious, ethical, and moral seeds in young hearts - preparing children for a future that involves spirituality. Parents able to choose this form of education make additional sacrifices that have timely rewards. Continue to pray for the success of Catholic Schools, and for the dedicated faculty who give much to what they do.

We are preparing for the annual Diocesan, Our Catholic Appeal 2022, entitled - 'As One Faith Family, We Trust in the Lord.' Over the past two years, our parishioners receiving envelopes from previous Parishes have been very generous in directing their annual, monthly gifts to Saint Cabrini Parish - and now in 2022 we have been given an amount to raise as a new Community of Faith in the Diocese of Orlando as our part in the journey to reach the Diocesan goal. Over the next few weekends we will be learning more about what OCA is about (beginning with Bishop Noonan's letter on page 3, and a diagram of how funding is allocated) - all leading up to Commitment Weekend on February 12/13. Based on a percentage of our previous fiscal year Offertory, Saint Cabrini's portion of the Diocesan Goal is \$53,901.00. I extend gratitude and appreciation to everyone as we soon begin, asking for a 100% participation from everyone.

MY SISTERS AND BROTHERS IN CHRIST:



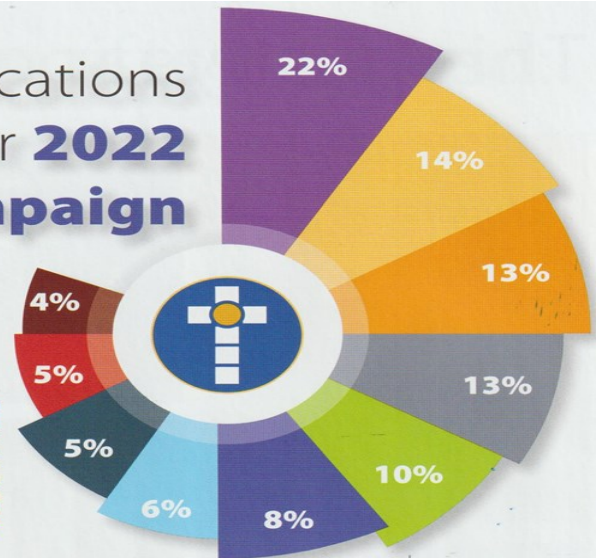
