FOURTH SUNDAY OF LENT



As Jesus went along, he saw a man blind from birth. His disciples asked him, "Rabbi, who sinned, this man or his parents, that he was born blind?" "Neither this man nor his parents sinned," said Jesus, "but this happened so that the works of God might be displayed in him. As long as it is day, we must do the works of him who sent me. Night is coming, when no one can work. While I am in the world, I am the light of the world." After saying this, he spit on the ground, made some mud with the saliva, and put it on the man's eyes. "Go," he told him, "wash in the Pool of Siloam" (this word means "Sent"). So, the man went and washed, and came home seeing. His neighbors and those who had

His neighbors and those who had formerly seen him begging asked, "Isn't this the same man who used to sit and beg?" Some claimed that he was. Others said, "No, he only looks like him." But he himself insisted, "I am the man." "How then were your eyes opened?" they asked. He replied, "The man they call Jesus made some mud and put it on my eyes. He told me to go to Siloam and wash. So, I went and washed, and then I could see." "Where is this man?" they asked him. "I don't know," he said. They brought to the Pharisees the man who had been blind. Now the day on which Jesus had made the mud and opened the man's eyes was a Sabbath. Therefore, the Pharisees also asked him how he had and opened the man's eyes was a Sabbath. Therefore, the Pharisees also asked him how he had received his sight. "He put mud on my eyes," the man replied, "and I washed, and now I see." Some of the Pharisees said, "This man is not from God, for he does not keep the Sabbath." But others asked, "How can a sinner perform such signs?" So, they were divided. Then they turned again to the blind man, "What have you to say about him? It was your eyes he opened." The man replied, "He is a prophet." They still did not believe that he had been blind and had received his sight until they sent for the man's parents. "Is this your son?" they asked. "Is this the one you say was born blind? How is it that now he can see?" "We know he is our son," the parents answered, "and we know he was born blind. But how he can see now, or who opened his eyes, we don't "and we know he was born blind. But how he can see now, or who opened his eyes, we don't know. Ask him. He is of age; he will speak for himself." His parents said this because they were afraid of the Jewish leaders, who already had decided that anyone who acknowledged that Jesus was the Messiah would be put out of the synagogue. That was why his parents said, "He is of age; ask him." A second time they summoned the man who had been blind. "Give glory to God by telling the truth," they said. "We know this man is a sinner." He replied, "Whether he is a sinner or not, I don't know. One thing I do know. I was blind but now I see!" Then they asked him, "What did he do to you? How did he open your eyes?" He answered, "I have told you already and you did not listen. Why do you want to hear it again? Do you want to become his disciples too?" Then they hurled insults at him and said, "You are this fellow's disciple! We are disciples of Moses! We know that God spoke to Moses, but as for this fellow, we don't even know where he comes from." The man answered, "Now that is remarkable! You don't know where he comes from, yet he opened my eyes. We know that God does not listen to sinners. He listens to the godly person who does his will. Nobody has ever heard of opening the eyes of a man born blind. If this man were not from God, he could do nothing." To this they replied, "You were steeped in sin at birth; how dare you lecture us!" And they threw him out. Jesus heard that they had thrown him out, and when he found him, he said, "Do you believe in the Son of Man?" "Who is he, sir?" the man asked. "Tell me so that I may believe in him." Jesus said, "You have now seen him; in fact, he is the one speaking with you." Then the man said, "Lord, I believe," and he worshiped him. Jesus said, "For judgment I have come into this world, so that the blind will see and those who see will become blind." Some Pharisees who were with him heard him say this and asked, "What? Are we blind too?" Jesus said, "If you were blind, you would not be guilty of sin; but now that you claim you can see, your guilt remains. John 9: 1-41

Formation Corner

Scriptural Stations of the Cross

The following Stations of the Cross are based on those celebrated by Saint Pope John Paul II on Good Friday, 1991. They are presented here as an alternative to the traditional Stations and as a way of reflecting more deeply on the Scriptural accounts of Christ's Passion.

Opening Prayer: God of power and mercy, in love you sent your Son that we might be cleansed of sin and live with you forever. Bless me as I reflect on his suffering and death that I may learn from his example - the way I should go. Through that same Christ, our Lord. Amen. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

First Station: Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane: Then Jesus came with them to a place called Gethsemane, and he said to his disciples, "Sit here while I go over there and pray." He took along Peter and the two sons of Zebedee, and began to feel sorrow and distress. Then he said to them, "My soul is sorrowful even to death. Remain here and keep watch with me." He advanced a little and fell prostrate in prayer, saying, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet, not as I will, but as you will." When he returned to his disciples he found them asleep. He said to Peter, "So you could not keep watch with me for one hour? Watch and pray that you may not undergo the test. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak." (Matthew 26:36-41)

Lord, grant me your strength and wisdom, that I may seek to follow your will in all things. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Second Station: Jesus, Betrayed by Judas, is Arrested: Then, while [Jesus] was still speaking, Judas, one of the Twelve, arrived, accompanied by a crowd with swords and clubs, who had come from the chief priests, the scribes, and the elders. His betrayer had arranged a signal with them, saying, "the man I shall kiss is the one; arrest him and lead him away securely." He came and immediately went over to him and said, "Rabbi." And he kissed him. At this they laid hands on him and arrested him. (*Mark 14: 43-46*)

Lord, grant me the courage of our convictions that my life may faithfully reflect the good news you bring. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Third Station: Jesus is Condemned by the Sanhedrin: When day came the council of elders of the people met, both chief priests and scribes, and they brought him before their Sanhedrin. They said, "If you are the Messiah, tell us," but he replied to them, "If I tell you, you will not believe, and if I question, you will not respond. But from this time on the Son of Man will be seated at the right hand of the power of God." They all asked, "Are you then the Son of God?" He replied to them, "You say that I am." Then they said, "What further need have we for testimony? We have heard it from his own mouth." (Luke 22: 66-71)

Lord, grant me your sense of righteousness that I may never cease to work to bring about the justice of the kingdom that you promised. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Fourth Station: Jesus is Denied by Peter: Now Peter was sitting outside in the courtyard. One of the maids came over to him and said, "You too were with Jesus the Galilean." But he denied it in front of everyone, saying, "I do not know what you are talking about!" As he went out to the gate, another girl saw him and said to those who were there, "This man was with Jesus the Nazorean." Again, he denied it with an oath, "I do not know the man!" A little later the bystanders came over and said to Peter, "Surely you too are one of them; even your speech gives you away." At that he began to curse and to swear, "I do not know the man." And immediately a cock crowed. Then Peter remembered the word that Jesus had spoken: "Before the cock crows you will deny me three times." He went out and began to weep bitterly. (Matthew 26: 69-75)

Lord, grant me the gift of honesty that I may not fear to speak the truth even when difficult. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Fifth Station: Jesus is Judged by Pilate: The chief priests with the elders and the scribes, that is, the whole Sanhedrin, held a council. They bound Jesus, led him away, and handed him over to Pilate. Pilate questioned him, "Are you the king of the Jews?" He said to him in reply, "You say so." The chief priests accused him of many things. Again, Pilate questioned him, "Have you no answer? See how many things they accuse you of." Jesus gave him no further answer, so that Pilate was amazed.... Pilate, wishing to satisfy the crowd, released Barabbas... [and] handed [Jesus] over to be crucified. (*Mark* 15: 1-5, 15)

Lord, grant me discernment that I may see as you see, not as the world sees. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Sixth Station: Jesus is Scourged and Crowned with Thorns: Then Pilate took Jesus and had him scourged. And the soldiers wove a crown out of thorns and placed it on his head, and clothed him in a purple cloak, and they came to him and said, "Hail, King of the Jews!" And they struck him repeatedly. (John 19: 1-3)

Lord, grant me patience in times of suffering that I may offer my life as a sacrifice of praise. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Seventh Station: Jesus Bears the Cross: When the chief priests and the guards saw [Jesus] they cried out, "Crucify him, crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Take him yourselves and crucify him. I find no guilt in him." ... They cried out, "Take him away, take him away! Crucify him!" Pilate said to them, "Shall I crucify your king?" The chief priests answered, "We have no king but Caesar." Then he handed him over to them to be crucified. So, they took Jesus, and carrying the cross himself he went out to what is called the Place of the Skull, in Hebrew, Golgotha. (John 19: 6, 15-17)

Lord, grant me strength of purpose that I may faithfully bear my cross each day. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Eighth Station: Jesus is Helped by Simon of Cyrene to Carry the Cross: They pressed into service a passer-by, Simon, of Cyrene, who was coming in from the country, the father of Alexander and Rufus, to carry his cross. (Mark 15: 21)

Lord, grant me a willing spirit that I may be your instrument on earth. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Ninth Station: Jesus Meets the Women of Jerusalem: A large crowd of people followed Jesus, including many women who mourned and lamented him. Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep instead for yourselves and for your children, for indeed, the days are coming when people will say, 'Blessed are the barren, the wombs that never bore and the breasts that never nursed.' At that time, people will say to the mountains, 'Fall upon us!' and to the hills, 'Cover us!' for if these things are done when the wood is green what will happen when it is dry?" (Luke 23: 27-31)

Lord, grant me a gentle spirit that I may comfort those who mourn. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Tenth Station: Jesus is Crucified: When they came to the place called the Skull, they crucified him and the criminals there, one on his right, the other on his left. [Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do."] (Luke 23: 33-34)

Lord, grant me a merciful heart that I may bring your reconciliation and forgiveness to all. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Eleventh Station: Jesus Promises His Kingdom to the Good Thief: Now one of the criminals hanging there reviled Jesus, saying, "Are you not the Messiah? Save yourself and us." The other, however, rebuking him, said in reply, "Have you no fear of God, for you are subject to the same condemnation? And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes, but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said, "Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom." He replied to him, "Amen, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise." (Luke 23: 39-43)

Lord, grant me perseverance that I may never stop seeking you. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Twelfth Station: Jesus Speaks to His Mother and the Disciple: Standing by the cross of Jesus were his mother and his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary of Magdala. When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, "Woman, behold, your son." Then he said to the disciple, "Behold, your mother." And from that hour the disciple took her into his home. (John 19: 25-27)

Lord, grant me constancy that I may be willing to stand by those in need. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you.

Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Thirteenth Station: Jesus Dies on the Cross: It was now about noon and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon because of an eclipse of the sun. Then the veil of the temple was torn down the middle. Jesus cried out in a loud voice, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit"; and when he had said this he breathed his last. (Luke 23: 44-46)

Lord, grant me trust in you that when my time on earth in ended, my spirit may come to you without delay. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.



Fourteenth Station: Jesus is Placed in the Tomb: When it was evening, there came a rich man from Arimathea named Joseph, who was himself a disciple of Jesus. He went to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus; then Pilate ordered it to be handed over. Taking the body, Joseph wrapped it [in] clean linen and laid it in his new tomb that he had hewn in the rock. Then he rolled a huge stone across the entrance to the tomb and departed. (Matthew 27: 57-60)

Lord, grant me your compassion that I may always provide for those in need. Lord Jesus, help me walk in your steps. I adore you, O Christ, and I bless you. Because by your holy cross you have redeemed the world.

Closing Prayer: Lord Jesus Christ, your passion and death is the sacrifice that unites earth and heaven and reconciles all people to you. May I who have faithfully reflected on these mysteries follow in your steps and so come to share your glory in heaven where you live and reign with the Father and the Holy Spirit one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

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
