FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

LENT

Catholic Lenten disciplines focus on three pillars – **Prayer**; **Fasting** (self-denial); and **Almsgiving** (charity) – and are designed to foster repentance and spiritual renewal over 40 days. Key obligations include abstaining from meat on Ash Wednesday, and all Fridays of Lent (ages 14+), and fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (ages 18 - 59). Lenten obligations are meant to be challenging, but not dangerous. The sick, pregnant, or frail, are exempt from fasting and abstinence.

Prayer: Increased, intentional time with God, such as attending daily Mass, praying the Rosary, reading Scripture, or participating in the Stations of the Cross, etc.

Fasting & Abstinence: Catholics aged 18 – 59 fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, meaning one full meal, and two smaller meals, that together do not equal a full meal. Abstinence (no meat) is required of those 14 and older, on Ash Wednesday, and all Fridays of Lent.

Almsgiving: Giving to the poor and needy, as a sign of charity and solidarity.

Spiritual Practices For Consideration:

Sacrifice: Voluntarily giving up comforts or habits (e.g., social media, specialty coffee & tea, sweets, alcohol, inappropriate language, etc.) to focus on spiritual growth.

Reconciliation: The Church encourages receiving the Sacrament of Penance/Confession during the Lenten Season.

Reflection: A period for deep spiritual reflection and repentance, in preparation for Easter.



Then Jesus was led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. After fasting forty days and forty nights, he was hungry. The tempter came to him and said, "If you are the Son of God, tell these stones to become bread." Jesus answered, "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes from the mouth of God.'" Then the devil took him to the holy city and had him stand on the highest point of the temple. "If you are the Son of God," he said, "throw yourself down. For it is written: 'He will command his angels concerning you, and they will lift you up in their hands, so that you will not strike your foot against a stone.'" Jesus answered him, "It is also written: 'Do not put the Lord your God to the test.'" Again, the devil took him to a very high mountain and showed him all the kingdoms of the world and their splendor. "All this I will give you," he said, "if you will bow down and worship me." Jesus said to him, "Away from me, Satan! For it is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve him only.'" Then the devil left him, and angels came and attended him. Matthew 4:1-11
